United Way of Washtenaw County invests in solutions that improve lives. Grants for programs and services that address critical community needs are a key strategy in our work. In the current fiscal year, community volunteers invested **over 2 million dollars** to support health and human services in our community.

Coordinated Funding Investments

As a member of the Washtenaw Coordinated Funders, United Way collaborates with the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation, and the Washtenaw County Office of Community and Economic Development (representing Washtenaw County, the City of Ann Arbor, and the Washtenaw Urban County Executive Committee) to invest 5.2 million annually to support our region's human service programs in five priority areas. Annually, United Way invests over 1.7 million through coordinated funding.
