### Coordinated Funding Investments

As a member of the Washtenaw Coordinated Funders, UWWC collaborates with the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation, the Washtenaw County Office of Community and Economic Development (representing Washtenaw County, the City of Ann Arbor, and the Washtenaw Urban County Executive Committee), and St Joseph Mercy Hospital Ann Arbor, to invest \$5 million annually to support our county's human service programs in four priority areas.
